Professor Andrea M. Berlin is the James R. Wiseman Chair in Classical Archaeology at Boston University. She received an MA in Syro-Palestinian Archaeology from the University of Chicago's Oriental Institute, and a Ph.D. in

Classical Art and Archaeology from the University of Michigan. She has been excavating in the eastern Mediterranean for over thirty years, working on projects from Troy in Turkey to Coptos in southern Egypt to Paestum, in Italy. Her speciality is the Near East from the time of Alexander the Great through the Roman era, about which she has written four books and over forty articles. Prof. Berlin is especially interested in studying the realities of daily life, and in exploring the intersection of politics and cultural change in antiquity. She is one

of the Archaeological Institute of America's most accomplished teachers and lecturers, having travelled to over 60 societies across the United States and Canada, most recently as the AIA's 2008 Joukowsky Lecturer. In 2009 she was awarded the AIA's Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching.
